COLUMBIA, Feb 17, 1865..

A partial success has attended the advance of the enemy ; but that circumstance will tend to draw us still more closely together ; and confirm our purpose to preserve the State. None are too old ; few too young to give some aid to our State in this hour of trial. Let all do what they can ; let all in this town gather under the call which has been made. It is only necessary that we should act firmly for a few hours, when others better suited to the duty will relieve you. At present all that you need apprehend is the incursions of raiders ; and to beat them back you have sufficient force here if you only will come forth and organize yourselves. The times call for one high resolve. Be firm, be ready, and all will be well.
