aid by the State, of not less than 3,000,000,-
three millions dollars, to assist the Citizens
of Columbia to rebuild. Our City Council
has appointed Mr J. G. Gibbs, Commissioner
in behalf of Columbia, asking for 1,000,000
this amt is inadequate as you will know.
By an act of liberality on the part of our
State, Columbia, very truly said by our
lamented Ex. Gov. Means. The City of Cats,
would soon be herself again.
