cellus Littlejohn, Jas. Petty, Wyatt Lipscomb, J. P. Wright
H. Lockhart, W. L. Lipscomb, M. C. McArthur, J. H. Garri-
son to assemble and meet together with me at David
Lipscomb's on the first day of February by 10 o'clock
A.M. to aid in organizing a court for the trial of said
slaves. Given under my hand and seal this 29th day
of Jan'y. 1865
