Dear Sir Your Let<sup>r</sup> of 24<sup>th</sup>

ult<sup>o</sup> was received in due course, ad-  
dressed to the Mayor of our Town, &  
I am requested by the Committee of  
Citizens to obtain & distribute Supplies  
for the Needy, to return you their  
Sincere thanks for your aid in  
their behalf. The Committee have  
found great difficulty in procuring  
transportation, so few parties having  
Mules & those busily Employed in prepara-  
-ation for the coming Crop, but they  
have secured two teams, which will  
now be constantly Engaged in bringing  
Supplies for the above purposes.

Mr. Fitzsimons, who attends to the  
transportation, suggests that you give  
an order to have any Supplies  
intended for the Winniboro Committee  
placed at the R.R. in Newberry  
& Mark<sup>d</sup> for the "Committee of Winniboro"  
which would then be subject to their

order. I could be procured at any time  
by their Agent. This course would  
seem to simplify matters. & thus save  
trouble & confusion. Mr Fitzsimons  
was at Newberry last week & says he  
could find nothing at the Depot for  
the Committee, but at that time he  
was not aware of your having made  
any arrangement for Supplies at  
that point.

wagon load and three bar-  
rels of flour which I sent  
to Lexington - He is to let  
the same ~~portion~~ portion of  
Lexington have 3000 lb of  
the last boat load - His  
having taken all the sup-  
plies to Columbia leaves  
nothing for Winnsboro  
except what Col Artin  
has and is buying up  
in Abbeville for that place  
I have as yet been unable  
to secure positively but one  
wagon under the order  
you gave me - I suppose  
however they will not be  
needed as the supplies  
seem to have ceased com-
