

Application for exemption or details of Dr. Edwin Parker
as Physician, and Apothecary and Druggist.

To His Excellency, A. G. McGoath, Governor of said State.

Application is hereby made for the exemption or
detail of Edwin Parker, as Physician, Apothecary & Druggist.

The said Edwin Parker is forty two years of age, was regularly
graduated in Medicine, and for the last five years has been
engaged in the practice of his professions, in the Town of
Alberle in said State, and now has his full share of practice
Jan 1860, and in the Spring of that year, he was joint owner
of a Drug Store in said Town, and attended himself, almost
exclusively to the various duties of the business. In the year
1862 he became the sole proprietor, and has ever since
devoted much of his time to its business. At the present time and for more
than two months he has had no assistant. He is skilled as an
Apothecary and Druggist, and does a considerable business
in the preparation and sale of Medicines and drugs. He has
for several years been rendered unable to take much exercise
on foot, or to stand in one position for any length of time, by the
displacement of the bones of his right foot, from which injury
he is at all times lame, and walks with some degree of pain.

He has one son, his sedentary child in the Military Service of the
State, and were he of physical ability, he would be quite ready
to render Military Service himself.

acquainted with Dr. Edwin Parker, who is about the age stated
in his application, is a practising Physician of good reputation
and a skilful and attentive Apothecary and Druggist, and as
such does a large business. He has, up to now, and for some time
has not had any assistant in his Drug Store, and the closing
of the said Store would be a much serious public inconvenience,
not only to this Com. Municipality, but to the District. Without the
presence of said Edwin Parker they believe his Drug Store
would be necessarily closed. They know said Edwin Parker
is lame in his right foot, which is disfigured by an injury,
and consider him, from that injury, altogether unfit for Military
service, and believe he is more useful at home than he would be in
the Military Service, and earnestly recommend his exemption or detail.
