My Kevison is on his way to Columbia charged by me with special despatches to the Mayor of that City, for the purpose of obtaining that information, which will enable me to do what I can in giving relief to the people of that City.

Mr. Kevison may and will probably need assistance in getting to Columbia. Should this be so, you will do what you can to secure his expeditious transit to his place of his destination.

For the present, the Head Quarters of the State will be at this place. It is very desirable that you should keep with me frequent communications by which I may be informed of the condition of public matters in your part of the State. The interruption of all State modes of communication has rendered it necessary for me to the establishment of Courier lines. These will pass through Newberry and will afford you frequent means of Communications with me.
